Prenatal care involves an ongoing process of risk identification, assessment and management. Prenatal care visits should begin in the first trimester. A typical visit schedule is every 4 weeks for the first 28 weeks of gestation, every 2 weeks until 36 weeks of gestation, and weekly thereafter.
