How to Answer a Source Question in History: 12 Steps

1. Use short quotations. – ‘Shows a very good understanding of all three sources in relation to both content and provenance’. – ‘present a balanced judgment... for the particular purpose given in the question’. – ‘ Interrogates the evidence of both sources with confidence and discrimination’.

How to get full marks in History A-Level source questions

Each historian, including you, will approach a source with a different set of experiences and skills, and will therefore interpret the document differently. Remember that there is no one right interpretation. However, if you do not do a careful and thorough job, you might arrive at a wrong interpretation. In order to analyze a primary source you need information about two things: the document itself, and the era from which it comes.

Never write an answer to a question without mentioning the source/s that is/are being referred to. ‘RULES’ for Paper 2 Rule #1 – Thou shalt answer the question directly in your first sentence.

Tips on how to answer exam questions CIE IGCSE History

For example: ‘The source is a diary, so may be reliable as it was written soon after the events it describes, and the author would have wanted to remember the events accurately.’ ‘The source is a play, so may be less reliable as the author may have wanted to entertain the audience, rather than communicate facts accurately.’

How to answer source-based questions – cross-referencing One of the most important things to remember is that a source should never be used in isolation.
